Counter Terror News and Solutions OSLO BOMBING

SITREP (Situational Report)

- At approximately 3:30 p.m. on July 22nd, 2011. local time an explosion occurred in the center of the city of Oslo, Norway. Initial reports confirmed multiple deceased and injured. The two explosions ripped through a government block in downtown Oslo, destroying the windows of buildings, including one that houses the Prime Minister's office.
- The blast occurred in and around government offices in the city center with multiple areas of targeting centers.
- The attack in Oslo killed at least seven people and at least 85 people died when a gunman opened fire at a Norwegian island youth camp just hours later.
- Initial reports also suggest a VBIED (Vehicle Borne Improvised Explosive Device).
 According to sources in Norway, the explosive device was combined of ammonium nitrate fertilizer and aspirin powder that was turned into pure acetylsalicylic acid.
- According to Bob Ayers, former U.S. intelligence official, the quantity of fertilizer found on the suspect's premises - 1000 pound of grain - wouldn't have fit in one car. Two burned-out cars could be seen at the scene Friday, but police have not confirmed whether they were used in the attack.
